Each of the 16 Jump Start Scholarship winners has been accepted at a Florida college, university, or technical school to pursue a career- or college-certificate program, or an associate degree in a high-demand career path. With the assistance of their Coach, each graduate completed a 3-Year Jump Start Plan, which serves as their roadmap to future success. This plan was based on meeting several requirements, including completion of: (a) a three-course (or two-year) high school course concentration (such as AVID or in CTE), (b) 25 or more hours of community service and/or paid work experience, and (c) the *Free Application for Federal Financial Assistance (FAFSA)* to locate other financial resources. Receiving a full-standing, college acceptance was the culminating or capstone scholarship requirement.

In 2022, 18 months after high school graduation, THE EARNINGS ADVANTAGE for college-credit certificate holders compared to high school diploma holders in FL WAS \$20,207 ANNUALLY.
